There are 54 articles altogether and below are some of the articles that the children attending Shenley Fields learn.

## Parents & carers as duty bearers respect children's right by:

**Article 28:**We have the right to learn and go to school.

Observe, plan and assess to ensure that every child makes the best possible progress in their learning and development.  
Provide library books for the children to take home

Ensure that you bring your child to their nursery sessions.  
Arrive on time to drop off and collect.  
Attend parent reviews and workshops.  
Share children's library books with them and give feedback to staff.

**Article 19:**We have the right to be looked after and kept safe, We should be protected from harm.

Using NPCC PANTS and internet safety resources with the children.  
Teach children about keeping safe with planned age appropriate activities.

Talk to your child about staying safe. Such as road safety, stranger danger and E safety.  
Let the nursery know if your child is not attending nursery that day.  
Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, report any concerns that you may have.

**Article 24:**We have the right to good food and clean water and to see a doctor if we are ill.

Provide healthy snacks at nursery.  
Through cooking activities teach children about healthy food.  
Water stations in each provision for children to access throughout the day.  
Teach children about good oral health

Provide only water in your child's drink s bottle.  
Provide healthy lunch boxes.  
Support your child to clean their teeth  
Take your child to visit the dentist.

**Article 30:**We have the right to speak our own language

Value children's home language  
Celebrate festivals and events with children and their families

Encourage children to speak their home language.  
Tell nursery about the festivals and events your family celebrate.

**Article 23:** If we have a disability we have the right to special care and education

Use Makaton to support language development  
Access appropriate support.  
Support plans to enable each child to reach their full potential

Attend meetings and appointments with other professionals and agencies.
